

Hill's Platform Has Plank To Abolish Campus 'Machine'

William T. "Johnny" Hill is a candidate for president of the Student Government Association. The 27-year old Decatur civil-engineering senior is president of the Baptist Student union, and a member of Phi Eta Sigma, Tau Beta Pi, Theta Tau, Chi Sigma, and ASCE.

PLATFORM:
